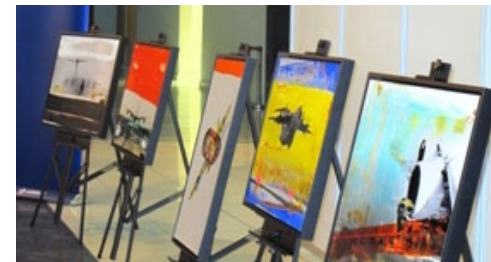


I Hope you have all enjoyed the Eid Al Adha break!

A350 XWB Final Assembly Line (FAL) was officially inaugurated this month. The 74,000 square-metre FAL, in Toulouse, will eventually employ some 1,500 people who will build up to ten aircraft a month as from 2018. As of today, the first two A350 XWB aircraft (the static aircraft and the first flyable aircraft, MSN001) are at different stages of final assembly.

The A380 also had a key milestone as it celebrated five years in business. This aircraft has been winning over business and leisure passengers alike since its service introduction in 2007, providing levels of comfort and reliability that have led travelers to specifically request flights on Airbus' 21st century flagship – which is in operation with carriers around the globe.

The A350 XWB Final Assembly Line already is well advanced in its initial build-up activity, with the first flightworthy aircraft and the programme's ground test airframe now being fabricated.

The photo-paintings will also be exhibited at Airbus sites around the world over the next two years. Half of the paintings will be shared

between Airbus sites, while the remaining half will be auctioned to raise funds for the Airbus Corporate Foundation.



Tony Soulié was born in 1955 in Paris. Since 1976, more than hundred personal and collective exhibitions are devoted to him throughout the world – New York, Los Angeles, Santiago, Tokyo, Paris, Shanghai, Toronto, Frankfurt, Bangkok, etc... Main international fairs present his work and about fifty French and foreign museums keep his photo-paintings. Tony Soulié got six awards for his work and in 2004 was decorated "Chevalier des Arts et des Lettres".
